THE SPORTS FIELD

Councillors would like to remind residents that the Sports Field is there for the enjoyment and use of everyone. A lot of Parish Council funds are spent to ensure that it attracts people of all ages and maintaining the area. Councillors kindly ask that users respect The Sports Field and its equipment.

A quick reminder of the following...

BBQs (including disposable BBQs) should not be used at the Sport Field. Councillors are deeply saddened to learn of damage to one of the newly installed picnic benches due to a user putting and leaving five disposable BBQs on top of the new picnic benches. The picnic bench has now had to be removed and it will be a huge expensive to either repair or replace this!



- Motorised vehicles (for example quad bikes and e-scooters) should not be ridden on the The Sports Field. The grass is being damaged and we even had an incident whereby these vehicles were being used on the playground equipment which again costs a great deal to repair.
- Dogs—all dog owners need to be responsible and pick up after their dogs, there are bins around The Sports Field that you can dispose of dog faeces in. A reminder that dogs should not be in the fenced off playground area, even if on a lead. Dogs should also be kept under control and if necessary remain on a lead at the Sports Field.
- Antisocial behaviour—please ensure you are kind and respectful to other users. We do have CCTV at The Sports Field and this can and is passed onto the police.

MAIDSTONE BOROUGH COUNCIL LOVE WHERE YOU LIVE GRANT

Broomfield and Kingswood Parish Councils application has been approved and the Parish Council have been awarded £400 towards bee and bird boxes, wild flower seeds and improving the village.

Six Month Leeds Road Closure Information

South East Water in partnership with KCC have now finalised the information for the six month road closure which starts on the 24th of July 2023. Please see information below.

Background re works

South East Water (SEW) will be returning to Leeds, Kent, for phase two of a more than £1 million project to improve the water network in the area as the community grows.

The entire project forms part of SEWs commitment to invest more than £489 million into upgrading and improving our infrastructure. Phase one of the project in Leeds involved laying a secondary pipeline in the area to support the growing community.

Phase two of this project is due to begin on Monday 24th of July. This vital scheme replaces approximately 535 metres of ageing burst-prone pipe with a new, wider water main. This will enable SEW to feed more water into the village and surrounding areas. The new main will protect supplies of top quality drinking water and reduce the number of occasions SEW have to disrupt the community by closing the road to repair a leaking main.

This investment will require the closure of Upper Street to through traffic for six months. Work within the closure will be phased to limit disruption and maintain access for residents and businesses, which will be open as usual.

Road closure and diversion information

SEW appreciate road closures are disruptive, and they are a last resort. However, for the safety of village residents, motorists and the workforce, Upper Street will be closed to through traffic between Burberry Lane and Forge Lane for the duration of the project.

This means there will be no through access between the A20 and Sutton Road via Leeds for the duration of the scheme.

For the safety of residents and motorists, and to prevent traffic congestion in the surrounding rural roads, SEW will also be closing a number of lanes in the area to through traffic.

SEW advise all traffic, particularly heavy goods vehicles, to follow the diversion route at all times. The diversion, agreed with Kent Highways, is suitable for all traffic that would have travelled via Leeds and is the safest route.


Road signs will be placed in advance, including electronic signage, to reinforce this message and advise of the diversion route.

There will be two public review meetings to discuss the traffic management – what's working and what can be improved. These will be held at St Nicholas Church, Leeds at 6pm on Tuesday 8th August and Thursday 14th September



Kingswood Speedwatch Group

The local Speedwatch group is a mix of people all from our local community, volunteering their time to undertake sessions around local roads and has support from the Parish council. This can be from an hour a month to a couple of hours a week, there is no expectation to do sessions it's just when people have available time. It has enabled people in the group to get to know more people from within our own village.

The group operates on various approved sites around the village, its aim is to try to educate road users of the importance of respecting the speed limits.

This is particularly relevant with the proposed road closure in Leeds village over the next 6 months. More vehicles will be using our local roads as an alternative route to enable them to get to their destination. It is estimated that we will see at least a doubling of traffic on some of our roads, based on experience of doing sessions when previous closures of that road has occurred.

In the last month we have recorded speeds of up to 46mph in a 30mph limit. It has been shown that the risk of injury increases by nearly five times at speeds over 30mph, this combined with increased traffic means our local roads are likely to become less safe for our residents.



You can help us try to keep speeds under control, by joining our group to enable us to carry out more sessions, during the road closure in Leeds. We would like more volunteers to join our group.

One of our volunteers says 'I feel I am making a difference to road safety in my community'.

<u>You</u> can make a difference as well, training is provided and you can get to meet other people from the local community.

Broomfield and Kingswood Parish Council's Chairman's Annual Report 2023

Another year and quite a busy one too. We have had highs and lows, we have had some successes, some partial successes and a few disappointments.

The year, which for the Council runs from AGM to AGM so from May to May, started with the Queen's Jubilee celebrations which, from the feedback we received, was a success with everyone who came along having a great time.

Unfortunately, due to loss of funding, we lost the Rural Kent Coffee Bus that used to come once a month during the warmer months. The Parish Council has tried to fill the gap by holding coffee mornings at the Village Hall during the school holidays and these have proved popular and have a growing attendance, please come along to the next one, they are open to all, and you get free cake too. Which reminds me that I must thank all the fantastic cake bakers in the village who kindly donate the cake.

We have been busy at the Sports Field, we have replaced some of the picnic tables and benches that were past their best with new multi-coloured table and benches that I think are great, they really bring a smile to your face when you see them. The plan is to gradually replace all the benches as needed.

Maintenance at the Sports Field is an ongoing project and this year we have repaired potholes in the car park and of course replaced or repaired any items in the play area as there was a need.

We lost our bus service this year due to Kent County Council cuts which was a major blow for some of our residents who relied on the bus to get about. With the cooperation of several of the surrounding parishes, chiefly led by Boughton Malherbe, we managed to secure funding from the KCC for a shopping bus service one day a week that goes direct to Maidstone on a Wednesday morning returning at lunch time. We have had very good reports about the service run by Nu-Venture, and I know that several residents are using it regularly. I would urge as many people as possible to continue to do so because if we lose the bus service altogether then it will be very hard to get it back and because if we can prove there is a need then maybe we can grow the service.

We have of course had the perennial problems of litter, traffic speeding and dog poo.

The litter in our lanes, which seems to have got worse since Covid, we have tried to tackle with litter picks. We have had five this year and will continue to do so, again with the help of some fantastic volunteers who turn up to help clean up.

We are also very happy to help support the Speedwatch volunteers who are doing a great job to help make our parish safer for us all.

The dog poo issue leaves me speechless, really how hard is it to just pick up after your dog???

The closure of Ulcombe Hill for months caused problems in our lanes and seems to be an ongoing problem with road closures on an almost weekly basis. The closure of the road through Leeds is going to be a major disruption and while it is understood that the works are necessary, we, together with the other surrounding parishes, are doing all we can to get the companies and Local Authorities involved to consider all the options for keeping disruptions to a minimum.

September brought the death of Queen Elizabeth II, for quite a few of us it was a real sadness as she had been Queen for most, if not all, of our lives and signified stability of what can seem to be a very unstable world at times. It will take a while before we can sing God Save the King without having to concentrate.

We obtained a grant for repairs to the finger post for which we have to thank Shellina Prendergast our local Kent County Council member.

Then came November and we were very proud to be able to support the Poppy Project, led by Ceridwen Clarke. What a triumph, all those beautiful poppies created by our local crafters, adults and children, who crocheted, knitted, cut out and painted, thousands of poppies to create an avalanche of poppies to decorate the Village sign. What a sight it was too, and the final touch was the cards of memorium to lost loved ones and I know that I shed a tear when reading the poem written by one of our own youngsters.

The Parish Council, at the Remembrance Sunday service, are proud to provide and lay a wreath on behalf of the parish. As part of our ongoing support for the Royal British Legion poppy day appeal we are buying a few large poppies each year to display around the parish.

The winter seemed to go on for a very long time this year, but then I say that every year. We have provided another salt bin on Broomfield Road at the corner of Park Barn in an effort to help when it does snow. All the existing salt bins proved very useful when the snow finally came, and we have made sure that they have been refilled for next year.

Christmas gave us another excuse for a get together and I know we are planning to hold another one this year so make sure you come along, there will probably be more cake.

Then came the Coronation, which was yet another excuse for a party. I had a great time and from what others have been saying so did they, in fact we have had requests to do it again.

I must take this opportunity to thank everyone who contributes towards making Broomfield and Kingswood such a good place to live. Firstly, to Hayley Roberts, our Parish Clerk, who makes a hard job look so easy. To everyone who gives up their time willingly, the other Councillors who try and keep things running smoothly and to make sure our voice is heard by the powers that be. To all the volunteers whether they be cake bakers, poppy makers or litter pickers. To all those who run the various Clubs and youth organisations and last but by no means least to all those who quietly and unobtrusively help make their neighbours lives just that little bit better by those acts of kindness that so often go unnoticed.

It looks as though the coming year is going to be another tough one (that seems to be becoming the "new normal"). Our powers are not great, but what we can do, we will do and if we cannot help, we may be able to point you in the right direction to get the help you need. So, remember we are your Parish Council and here to support you.

Annual Ward Members Report 2023 - Gill Fort, MBC Councillor for Leeds

Annual Report for 2022/23

Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II

It is with deep sadness the Queens death was announced on 8th September. Maidstone as the county town of Kent lead the proclamation of the new King on Sunday 11th September in Jubilee Square. The proclamation was delivered by the High Sheriff of Kent, Russell Race. In attendance were many dignitaries, other Kent boroughs and large number of members of the public.

Cost of Living Crisis

Many residents are struggling with rising energy costs and inflation. We have seen rises in essential food which means some families cannot afford to put a meal on the table. MBC have set up a web page which has help and guidance. It can be found at

Maidstone has helped 53 households from becoming homeless due to the Covid 19 pandemic by using a government grant to help clear mortgage, rent, council tax and utility bills arrears.

1000 Affordable Homes

It is MBC strategy to build 1000 affordable homes. MBC recognises the need for more affordable housing in the area and is determined that those in the local community who may not be able to afford to buy or rent privately have the opportunity to live in one of these new affordable homes.

Local Plan Review

MBC has received confirmation that the first stage of the Local Plan Review examination has been successful and will proceed to stage 2. The main impact for our area is that the Leeds Langley safeguarding area which will not now feature in the plan. Work will continue with KCC and other stakeholders so that any plan for a relief road will be in the next plan.

Bins and Rubbish

Mid Kent Partnership, which MBC is part, have awarded an eight-year contract to SUEZ. The new contract will begin in March 2024 and will introduce new technology and industry improvements. Existing employees of Biffa will transfer to the new contractor. If anyone has any concerns with the service being provided, they should report it.

Ukraine

Maidstone has housed a number of Ukrainian Refugees and more than 60 attended a gathering with the Mayor to commemorate Ukrainian Independent Day. The Town Hall was lit with the national colours of blue and yellow.

Town Centre Strategy

This strategy will aim to create a range of new retail, leisure and employment opportunities for people, businesses and communities in the town centre and across the borough. It will identify a variety of new education, health and other infrastructure projects all to reinforce Maidstone as the county town of Kent and the business capital of Kent.

Mote Park

A new café opened in Mote Park. This is the second phase of the council's investment into the redevelopment of Mote Park. Further plans include renovation the toilet block.

Kingswood Speedwatch Group

The Speedwatch group was formed early in 2022 to try and eradicate speeding within our village and surrounding area. Initially the group consisted of 7 volunteers and formal training was completed on 10th February last year.

Since formation the group has grown to 12 people and it is a mix of people all from our local community, volunteering their time to undertake sessions around local roads. This can be from an hour a month to a couple of hours a week, there is no expectation to do sessions it's just when people have available time.

Speedwatch is a county wide group and data is collated across the county and last year they identified 30,673 people speeding. It is fully supported by Kent Police and has support of county's Police and Crime Commissioner, Matthew Scott.

Key information gathered over the last year...

Local residents in the ME17 3, ME17 2 and ME17 1 postcodes are the biggest offenders.

Lenham Road and Broomfield Road attract the highest speeds – highest speed recorded so far being 55mph in the village built up area of Broomfield Road!

Average speed is 37.4mph.

17,000 cars have been recorded710 of these were travelling at over 35mph

150 sessions with over 500 volunteer hours have been completed in 15 months.

We want to say a big thank you to all of our volunteers for their hard work and commitment.

The group would really benefit from more volunteers to help with the sessions, which would enable us to do them more regularly throughout the week.

Our supporting churches are: Baptist, Methodist and the Church of England

Kingwood Church meets each Sunday at Kingswood & Broomfield Village Hall our services commence at 11am. We welcome anybody who would like to attend, our style of worship is less formal but follows the traditions of our supporting church. During the service we run a children's group 'Climbers' they join the congregation at the start of the service then leave after the first hymn for their own activities which includes many types of craft and even cooking, together with their Bible studies, they return at the end of the service to show and tell what they have made and learnt.

We run a Café Service on the first Sunday of each month, the service starts at 11 am. A free continental breakfast is served from 10.30 am.

Kingswood Church is not just for Sunday's we offer many groups and activities across the week together with pastoral support where needed.

On Tuesdays we run a lunch club, we each take our own lunch, tea, coffee and biscuits are provided and we gather round the table for a chat on any subject.

On Friday's Sonya runs a Lady's Group at her home, tea, coffee and cake together with a chat and prayers are offered.

Friday afternoon we run an after-school group called 'Crusaders' at Kingswood School the children learn about stories from the Bible and play quizzes and games etc.

Friday Evenings we run a church youth club called 'CANS' the children have a chance to unwind playing games and crafts, once a month they hold a family activity, Prize Bingo and Film-Nights are very popular.

This year we have continued to support many charities and a local Foodbank through the donations of our congregation.

Throughout the year we also run special services e.g., Easter, Harvest and Christingle.

We support the Well Blessing each year at St Margaret's Church, Broomfield and our children provide floral decorations for the service.

All in all, we have had a solid year having recovered from the Covid Pandemic, we look forward to the warmer weather, and the continued life of our church.


Kingswood and Broomfield Birdwatching Group July 2023

Dear Fellow Residents

KABBS was formed during lockdown in 2021 so we are very much a fledgling group, seeking to expand and grow our knowledge. We are a very friendly group who love a good natter and the occasional gentle trip to a reserve or local site. Please don't pay too much attention to our title as we have members from surrounding areas such as Lenham, Ulcombe and Headcorn – geography is no restriction on membership! Please also be aware that mobility is no issue either – we aim to be as inclusive as possible; anyone can enjoy watching the birds!

Our aims are broadly (but not restricted to):

- To record species in the parish
- To arrange group walks
- To share knowledge
- To hold regular meetings
 - To note other forms of wildlife in the area

In terms of trips, we mix occasional reserve visits with more local stuff too. A group of us visited Sevenoaks Nature Reserve in April with some interesting sightings to be had. We have planned visits for Rye Harbour and Wildwood Trust in the coming months.

Currently we meet regularly at Ulcombe Village Hall. Our last meeting was on 26th June, and our next meetings will be:

Monday 25th September (TBC) Monday 11th December (TBC)

At a meeting last year at the hall, we were lucky enough to observe a pair of little owls busy hunting in the adjacent playing field. They have also seen them perched on telegraph poles along the Ulcombe Hill/Headcorn Road.

As regards recent sightings and patterns locally, the skylarks remain present in good numbers up on the large crop field between Broomfield Road and Park Barn Farm Road, although on a recent visit in May, they were absent. A few yellowhammers can also be found there if you are lucky and have been sighted visiting gardens in Kingswood. Siskins, goldcrests, nuthatches, bullfinches and great spotted woodpeckers appear to be in healthy numbers round the parish still. More excitingly, a pair of tawny owls successfully raised at least 3 young in the woods behind Kingswood village post office. Also, red kites are being spotted more frequently in the skies above the parish, along with the usual buzzards. A member located in Broomfield reported that ravens have also been spotted in the area.

I hope we can welcome many more new members in the coming weeks and months. Meantime, enjoy the nature around us – we are so lucky to have such wonderful diverse countryside still, especially given the ever-encroaching development going on nearby.

KENT CYNOPHOBIA ASSISTANCE GROUP

Monday evenings at 5.30

Cynophobia is a Greek word, Cyno is dog, Phobia is fear, so it simply means the 'fear of dogs' We are now in our 8th year, having helped so many children overcome their fear of dogs. We have 14 dogs on our list, we have a rota of seven dogs each Monday, helping on average each week 20 children. We are always on the lookout for new dogs, they do have to have some basic training and are off sound temperament.

Our success rate is that 90% of children stroke a dog within the first hourly session, often to the amazement of parents. These children having had a lot of encouragement to even get out of their car.

Over the years, we are proud to say that we have changed so many families lives for the

Lead the Way Dog Training. Wednesday evenings.

We run Puppy training classes following the Kennel Club Puppy Foundation Course, after which you can continue with us and gain the KC Bronze, Silver and Gold awards. We are also experienced with rescue dogs too. We run very popular dog training classes throughout the evening.

Our senior trainer is a Kennel Club Accredited Instructor, City & Guilds and affiliated to the British Institute of Professional Dog Trainers. Last year we lost Marion Street who has moved from the area and so is unable to come along to take some of the classes, although she is still helping on a Monday where many of the dogs we have trained have gone on to become assistance dogs or cynophobia dogs helping the children overcome their fear. Shukokai Karate Academy



This year has seen some remarkable performances from many Kingswood students in local, national, and international competitions. Students have travelled to Spain, Turkey, France and shortly to Croatia, to compete in international competitions and to Glasgow for the British Championships. At the same time our grass roots, traditional karate classes have continued to provide a conduit for adults and children of all ages, to develop their martial art skills, confidence and coordination. This year is the eighteenth that karate has been taking place in the village and it is amazing to see some of those that started with us now engaged as doctors, engineers, estate agents, academics, and many other careers.

April saw a milestone in the Shukokai Karate Academy's history when it hosted its largest tournament to date, the Southern England Karate Open, which attracted 450 competitors representing clubs from all over the country. The event took place in the main sports hall at the University of Kent at Canterbury and included both kata (forms), kumite (fighting) and Kickmaster categories for students aged 4 to veterans, as well as events for visually and physically impaired. World, European and Nationally qualified referees and judges officiated over the five areas that were in operation for 11 hours of the day. Members from the Kingswood club were part of the SKA team who finished top of the medals table with 8 gold, 10 silver and 25 bronze medals.

Away from competitions we have held several grading classes where students progress through our established belt system. In October we will be holding our annual course and senior grade grading where several students hope to attempt their black belt test after training with us for in excess of 5 years.

Classes run in the Kingswood village hall on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays, with clubs also running at Lenham, Downswood, Marden, Sutton Valence and Maidstone YMCA, with a new club opening in September in Dartford. Hedgehogs in Kingswood by Ceridwen Clarke

Hedgehog footprints Front and Rear

Q. What's got over 6,000 spines, a cute nose and can run really fast? A. A hedgehog!

The spines are for protection and hedgehogs roll into a spikey ball when they are frightened. The cute little nose gives them a terrific sense of smell to find food. And their little legs really go like the clappers, so when they have to, they can run at almost 3 metres a second, for short distances (almost 5 mph!).

British hedgehogs need our help, because we've taken away their habitats and food. We've built roads and buildings where there was open land and we use pesticides to kill the insects, slugs and snails they usually munch. Because of this they are a threatened species in the UK, but we can help them. They are secret to most of us, because they only come out at night, they freeze when they see us, and they hide in winter. We've been lucky to have 3 hedgehogs visiting our garden in Kingswood, we have a feeding station in everyday use and a house ready for them for the winter, when they sleep through the cold.

Our kind neighbour allowed us to make a Hedgehog Tunnel through her fence, so that the hogs could go between our gardens, they often roam 2 to 3 kilometres each night, so they need access through walls or under fences. She even made them a step in case the tunnel was too high for their little legs, and we also use the tunnel to pass things between us! We have a trail camera to watch "our" hoggies and we put out food (kitten biscuits) and fresh water and because they have a very keen sense of smell, they arrive most nights at about 9.30, it's such a delight to see them and observe their behaviour. Which isn't always good, the males are bullies, they barge and shove one another around and the mating courtship is very noisy and prolonged. The male will circle around and around the female, and she backs away until she is ready to accept a mate, squealing and squeaking all the time. And, they pee and poo everywhere!

If you'd like to help hedgehogs and maybe encourage them to your garden, here's what you can do:

- Leave an untidy corner of the garden and make hedgehog highways with holes in fences and tunnels in walls
- Put large shallow dishes of water out, especially during hot weather
- Try not to use chemicals in the garden
- Check before you strim or burn the undergrowth

If you see a hedgehog out in daylight, that's not right and it needs urgent help. Call for rescue help and to keep it safe, if you can, wearing thick gloves, pick it up and put it in a high sided box, with old towels to hide in and a hot-water bottle wrapped in a towel to keep it warm. Add a dish of water, but no food.



The small town of Rye is well known as a tourist centre, combining a fine heritage of historic buildings with a unique hilltop setting. As one of the Cinque Ports Confederation, Rye at one time provided ships for the king in return for privileges. In 1377 it suffered a disastrous raid by the French, and much of the rebuilt medieval town survives to the present day.



St. Mary's Parish Church from Lion Street in the 1950's. The church tower with it's squat spire forms the summit of the hilltop town. The 18th Century Quarter Boys strike the quarter hours only - not the hours.

Simon the Pieman Tea Room is still open for business today, and is thought to be the oldest Tea Room in Rye.








Ypres Tower was built in the 13th Century and functioned as the town's jail from 1494 to 1891.







The Rye Harbour Ferry served the crews of fishing and trading vessels moored on both banks of the Rother, in addition to visitors to Camber.

The ferryman ran two boats, one having a keel for use at high tides, the other being flat-bottomed for low tides.




